We apply innovative research to prevent and respond to sexual and relationship violence, stalking, and harassment.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) describe our work as the "gold-standard" in evidence-based prevention and response strategies.

We have published over 400 peer-reviewed articles.

We pioneered the bystander intervention strategies which are delivering lasting cultural change in colleges, high schools, and workplaces in the US and globally.

In 2018, our directors launched the non-profit company Soteria Solutions, which uses research-proven solutions to prevent and respond to incivility, harassment, violence, and discrimination in education and workplace settings.

The Prevention Innovations Fellows program brings together dozens of sexual violence researchers and practitioners from across the US to collaborate on publications, projects, and strategies to translate research to practice.
